The aim of the Middleville Agricultural Society's Light Horse Show is to provide a venue for riders to gain experience and confidence in showing their horses, and to have fun!

- English or Western attire for all classes
- "Open" means all ages.
- Junior: 17 and under
- Senior 18 and over.

Rider ability to count for equitation classes. Riders in lead line classes are not eligible for classes requiring a jog/trot. Riders in walk-trot/jog classes are not eligible to ride in canter/lope classes. Costume classes judged on costume only with all ages and leaders welcome.

ALL COMPETITORS (English and Western) ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR AN A.T.S.M. APPROVED HELMET AND BOOTS WITH A HEEL.

9. Lead line game, cup race (riders must carry a cup of jelly beans and the one with the most beans at the end wins)

 14. Slalom under Saddle, English or Western, timed event
