Please register at the office and provide proof of rabies vaccination for any and all dogs, cats and ferrets

All family pets must be leashed / caged and under complete control by handlers while on fair premises.

Regulation regarding Rabies Vaccinations

Due to new 2018 Rabies Vaccination Regulations, all spectator-owned pets, ie. dogs, cats, ferrets, must be vaccinated for rabies in order to be allowed on the fairgrounds.

Any horses, cattle, or sheep going into exhibiting classes do not need to be vaccinated. However, if these animals are part of an interactive display for public spectators, they will require the vaccine, ie. if they are part of a Vendor's booth display.

Animals that are exempt from the vaccination regulations due to there being no available rabies vaccine, are goats, swine, alpacas, llamas & rabbits. Poultry cannot contract rabies.
